In a June 2015 *Vanity Fair* article, Sebastian Junger highlighted the challenges of post-traumatic stress among veterans. He suggested “making every town and city hall in the country available to veterans who want to speak publicly about the war.” He believed that holding these community forums would “return the experience of war to our entire nation, rather than just leaving it to the people who fought.”

Attendees at these events are asked to please refrain from responding to any speaker at any time. There is no question-and-answer period, debate on the merits or justifications of war, recriminations or accusations. This is simply a chance for veterans to tell the community what it felt like to go to war. The events are non-political, and all perspectives are valued.

The first event of this kind in Vermont was held in November 2017 at Burlington’s Contois Auditorium. Both Burlington and Rutland will host Veterans Town Hall events on November 4th, 2018.
